

Muhly Grass



Pronounced Mew-Lee. This ornamental grass is a FL native that is drought tolerant and very hardy. Easy to grow and low maintenance muhly grass puts on a nice show of purple/pink or white color in late fall/early winter.

MAINTENANCE: Can be cut back to 12-18" after last frost to make room for new growth. Can also be thinned and divided appx every 3 years to maintain upright growth and avoid over clumping.

Hydrangea



Hydrangea is a large shrub with beautiful masses of color. They fill gardens with their green, leafy foliage and incredible blooms during the warm months. The color will vary from pink to blue depending on the soil pH, which white variations also available.

MAINTENANCE: Pruning can be accomplished at two different times. Late summer is more desirable, since most of these hydrangea types flower only from the end buds of upright or lateral shoots produced during late summer and fall of the previous season. Prune as soon as the flowers have faded and strong shoots are developing from the lower parts of the stems and crown. Remove at the base some of the weaker shoots that are both old and new. Always try to keep several stems of old productive wood, with a sufficient number of stout new stems that will flower the following season.

Cast Iron Plant



Growing in large, leafy clumps, cast iron plant is unsurpassable for dependable, dark green foliage in very lowlight conditions. The glossy, coarse-textured leaves provide an excellent background for low flowering annuals or make effective mass plantings when allowed to spread by underground stems into a groundcover. It also makes a nice statement in front of a shrub border.

MAINTENANCE: Remove dead leaves, thin if dense clumps have formed.

Lantana



Lantana is a low-maintenance perennial with brightly colored flowers that attract butterflies. Lantana enjoys full sun, and while it is drought-tolerant, it will flower more when watered regularly. It should also be noted that the unripened berries are poisonous to humans, and the leaves are highly toxic to animals.

MAINTENANCE: Lightly prune to maintain desired shape and size in the growing season. In the winter lantana can frost back to the ground and can be pruned down to 4-6" from the ground to regrow in spring.

Bottlebrush



The common name "bottlebrush", perfectly describes this evergreen plant's bright red flower spikes. Hummingbirds love the flowers, and the plant is hardier than most bottlebrushes. The flowers are followed by small, woody capsules that look like bead bracelets on the bark, and which last for years.

Bulbine



Bulbine has become a popular plant in Florida because it is drought tolerant, grows well in poor soils, and blooms repeatedly with cheerful flowers that are yellow or orange, depending on the variety. It makes a great ground cover since each plant will grow over time to form a clump that can reach up to four feet wide.
